TABLE TENNIS






Tuesday Film Group

These are just a few of the amazing people who have joined the group and share their skills. There are many more, as everyone has some skill to share. Many of the wonderful items produced by the Craft





It has been a delight to see the development that has occurred in French pronunciation, sentence construction and reading by these keen learners, who have been expressing themselves confidently in this foreign language.

The Beginners French 1 class has also made great progress, mastering basic grammar, enjoying simple comic strips, learning how to put sentences together and reading short passages. One of their major achievements was conversing with a French guest speaker, asking and answering questions.

It was also rewarding to get feedback from students who travelled overseas during the year and had been able to order food, use public transport and have brief chats with the locals.


SCIENCE FICTION BOOK CLUB

For 2025 we have chosen an eclectic list of books by authors Arthur C Clarke, Adrian Tchaikovsky, Larry Niven, Sarah Jackson, Isaac Asimov, Hugh Howey, Ursula Le Guin, Kazuo Ishiguro and Ben Bova. They deal with topics ranging from extraterrestrial intelligence, robots, post-apocalyptic worlds, galactic futures, social impacts of future worlds, parallel worlds and space tourism.


MEMBER SURVEY 2024
